

INTRODUCTION

The Faculty of Mechanical and Manufacturing Engineering (FKMP), UTHM was established with the objective of carrying out programmes that are planned to fulfill the functions of the university towards the achievement of its vision and mission and also to carry out researches and developments that are innovative as required by the country. Beside offering academic programmes that is competitive, the faculty also acts as a reference centre in areas of Mechanical and Manufacturing Engineering as well as in related technologies.

FKMP has started as a Department of Mechanical Engineering at the establishment of this institution in 1993 which is known as Pusat Latihan Staf Politeknik (PLSP). The centre was then given the name Tun Hussein Onn Institute in 1996 and subsequently given the status as an independent university called Kolej Universiti Tun Hussein Onn (KUiTTHO) on the 30th of September, 2000. At this time the university established 2 faculties which were called Faculty of Engineering (FK) and Faculty of Engineering Technology (FTK). Mechanical Engineering was split into 2 departments, The Department of Mechanical Engineering in the Faculty of Engineering and the Department of Mechanical Engineering Technology in the Faculty of Engineering Technology. On 1st May, 2004 FK and FTK were merged and the Faculty of Mechanical and Manufacturing Engineering (FKMP) was established.
